How do I search exclusions?

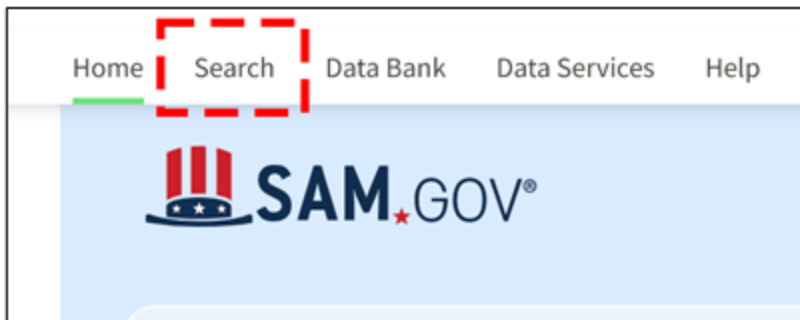

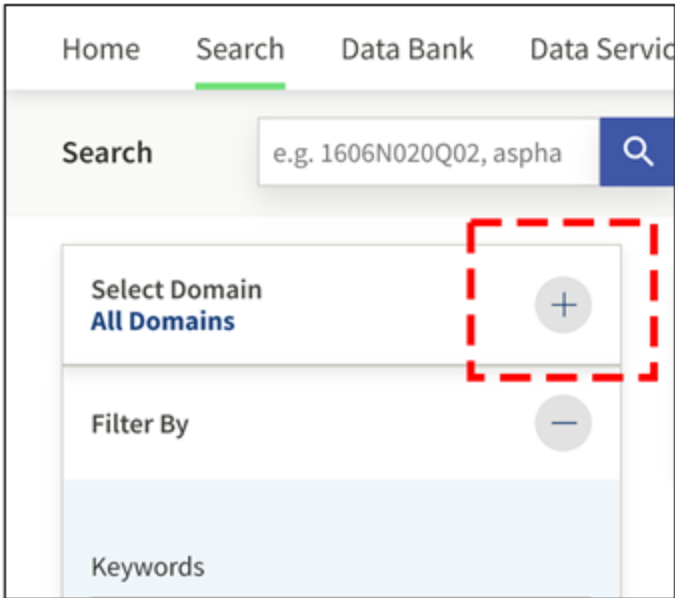

Follow the steps below to search for exclusions in SAM.gov:

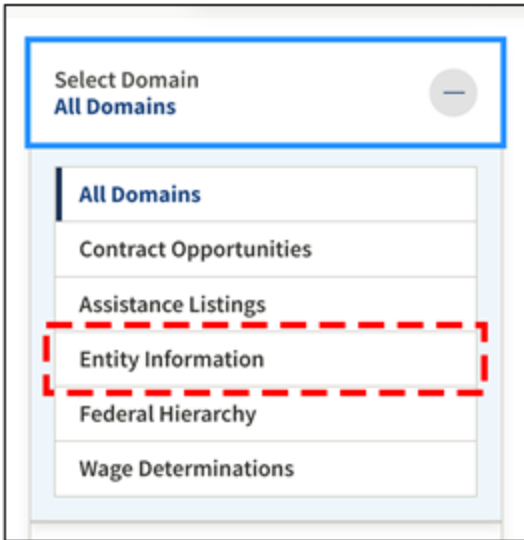
1. From any page on SAM.gov, select "Search" in the menu.

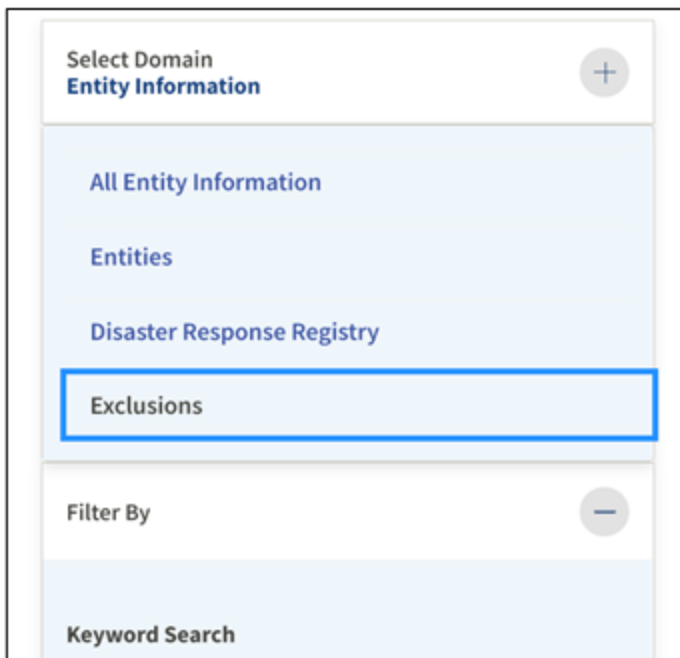


2. From the Search page, select the plus sign next to "Select Domain."



3. Select "Entity Information" from the list, then select "Exclusions."





4. Next, enter an entity's name, Unique Entity ID (SAM), or CAGE code. To search for a person, you can search by their name, Social Security Number, or tax identification number (TIN).

5. Enter additional criteria into filters on the left side of the page to narrow your results.

Only active exclusions are publicly searchable. If no exclusion record is found for an entity or individual, there is no active exclusion. View these instructions to save or print documentation that an entity has no active exclusions.
