FISCAL YEAR 2021 IMPACT AT A GLANCE

Every dollar invested by the State of Mississippi was leveraged to secure an additional \$7.31 in non-state funding

- Generated over **\$6 million** in outside resources from AmeriCorps, businesses, foundations, public-private partnerships, and other sources in the state
- Administered 11 AmeriCorps programs that provided over 400 opportunities for individuals to serve their communities
- Over \$3,802,241 in educational awards were earned by AmeriCorps members
- Tutored over 2,513 students and prepared over 250 pre-K students for school
- Provided health education to over **590 youth**
- Prepared **419 individuals** to enter the workforce
- Treated over **60 acres** of public land
- Tracked over **240,000 hours of volunteer service**
- Trained over 576 nonprofits in volunteer management and capacity building
- Matched 5,000 volunteers with rewarding volunteer opportunities at over 650 nonprofits
